Three 2025 Academy Graduates

Phase I: The Academy

A community-led education program for underestimated entrepreneurs.

The Academy is a two-phase program. It begins with a *10-week program* that equips underestimated entrepreneurs with the knowledge, tools, and networks they need to plan, start, and grow their own small businesses.

Entrepreneurs learn business foundations like customer acquisition, accounting principles, legal structures and more. These weekly classes are led by former graduates and local business leaders; keeping the program community-led is vital to our mission.

We go even deeper in community building by bringing in **guest speakers**, who are proficient business owners and subject matter experts (like accountants and lawyers), to expand our entrepreneurs’ professional network and provide insights that will help them avoid common pitfalls in early-start businesses.

Since its inception in 2016, **The Academy has graduated 1,796 entrepreneurs**, each in various stages of small business ownership.

It Adds Up: Pitch Winner on a Roll

The lights were so bright on stage that Jill couldn’t look out to see the crowded room full of family, friends, peers, and strangers all there to celebrate entrepreneurship. She took a deep breath *and began*.

She told the crowd about her Mathnasium business and how it sets kids up for success, seamlessly flowing through her presentation, the weeks of hard work and practice paying off. With a racing heart, standing hand-in-hand with her fellow contestants, she heard Shana shout her name **“First place winner... Jill Miller!”**

Access to capital is a serious obstacle for early-start entrepreneurs, which is why programs like The Academy can really change the game for our neighbors. Less than a month after her amazing accomplishment on stage, Jill hit another business milestone: **she signed her very first lease in December 2025!** The Academy sets entrepreneurs, like Jill, up for success in just 10 weeks.

During our famous break-even week of curriculum, Jill was able to create a profit/loss statement for her commercial lease application. “After class I was able to accurately list my fixed and variable costs and provide a sales forecast. My lease application was approved on the first submission!”

Corner to Corner **definitely** made the difference in me being able to submit a quality application packet. I now have a complete business plan with real numbers.”

Plus, utilizing her first-place winnings, **she is now able to provide a 7-month scholarship for a student** at her new Mathnasium location! “7-months is typically the turning point where we see improvement in math skills when [using a] personalized learning plan.” This entrepreneurship program is changing lives just like Jill’s *all throughout Nashville*.

In addition to giving our neighbors the knowledge, tools, and networks they need to thrive as business owners, The Academy is also **creating a community that looks at the whole person behind the business**. “The day I graduated, I walked away from Corner to Corner embracing the fact **I CAN do this**. In the beginning I truly lacked confidence, because there was so much I didn’t know. By the end, it gave me access to a network of people who were like-minded, [showing me] that **I was not the only one** with these feelings and could reach out when I needed help.”

Jill can find comfort and stability knowing that **after graduation, that network only strengthens**. We prioritize supporting the 1,796 (+ growing!) Academy Alumni through additional education, mentorship opportunities, networking events, and more! “Supporting initiatives like [The Academy] *truly puts* underserved communities on stages they would never have access to. **It’s the missing link between a dream and having the tools to pursue it.**”

With the support of our community, entrepreneurs like Jill can hit those business milestones with confidence, equipped with the tools they need to continue growing!

Phase II: The Academy Alumni

The Academy Alumni Program goes further than helping entrepreneurs launch their businesses; it helps them flourish as business owners.

This second phase of continued investment in our entrepreneurs is multifaceted, offering Academy Alumni access to additional **educational resources, mentorship opportunities**, and our pilot **loan program, The Academy Invested**.

Whether our entrepreneurs want to dive deeper into e-commerce, digital marketing, or business finances, this program offers classes they can take advantage of. **In 2025, we served hundreds of our Academy Alumni** with creative and proven programming.



Impact in Action

The Academy Alumni programming has **6 key pillars**.

- 1. Legal Education** - We provide graduates with a 7-part online curriculum to learn all about the legal side of business, like how to handle contracts. In addition, we also provide a ProBono Legal Clinic in partnership with Bradley Law Firm.
- 2. E-Books** - Whether our entrepreneurs want to dive deeper into Point of Sale Systems, Operating Agreements, Acquiring Customers Beyond Social Media or more, they tap into our extensive e-book collection for further education.
- 3. In-person classes** - We also provide small-group, in-person classes that focus on a variety of topics, like e-commerce, digital marketing, pricing strategy, or business finances.
- 4. Bookkeeping + Finances** - Financial literacy is a mainstay of our alumni programming. We introduce alumni to local bankers who help them open business bank accounts and set up healthy financial foundations they can grow upon.
- 5. Vandy Impact** - Through our partnership with Vanderbilt University, a select number of our graduates have gained access to their \$25,000 loan program, allowing for immense business growth.
- 6. 1:1 Mentorship** - Through our Business 2 Business program, we provide 1:1 mentorship opportunities, where local business leaders volunteer to mentor graduates to achieve specific goals for their business.

Academy Invested Loans *in Action!*

Antonia Royal-Whitmore – Publack Library

Antonia used her microloan to **fund the illustration of her book** Treasures of Truth: The Untold Story of St. Patrick's Day. The loan allowed her to **publish the book** in time for St. Patrick's Day, resulting in sales and community impact. Her loan has already **been repaid in full**, showing both financial responsibility and business growth.



Mishayla Jackson – Heal N Center

Mishayla invested her loan into **professional certifications and licenses**, including massage therapy, healing touch renewal, and Yoga Alliance registration. These credentials have **legitimized and expanded her wellness practice**. With this foundation in place, she now has the momentum and goal to open a brick-and-mortar location as her revenue increases.

Yasmine used her microloan to **purchase and restock inventory** for her physical Bible studies. The high demand for her resources meant that she needed additional inventory quickly, and the **loan gave her the flexibility to meet that demand** and sell out in days, continuing to grow her business.



Business in Bloom

We loaned Jacklyn McInstosh \$1,500 at the start of the year, and she has now officially repaid the full amount! She used the loan to cover her **monthly subscription to a wedding-planning platform**

where clients can discover and book her for floral design work. **Her investment paid off quickly**. Just last month, she completed two weddings—one at the *Opryland Gaylord Event Center* and another at a *downtown venue*, **earning \$10,000 from those two events alone**. She has also been reinvesting in her growth through targeted social media marketing and printed brochures. Recently, Jacklyn formed a new partnership with a funeral home to provide floral arrangements, expanding both her experience and her client base. With these new referrals and her growing portfolio, she is positioned to book even more weddings and continue building her business.

As we charge toward our audacious goal of launching **10,000 entrepreneurs in 10 years** – and remain firmly on track despite 2025’s hurdles – **my greatest hope for the coming year is** that we continue discovering innovative ways to support both our entrepreneurs and community members who partner with us.

This year reminded us that our core values aren’t just words on a wall; they’re the foundation that keeps us leaning into each other during hard times instead of pulling away. **This is how we continue to push forward**. 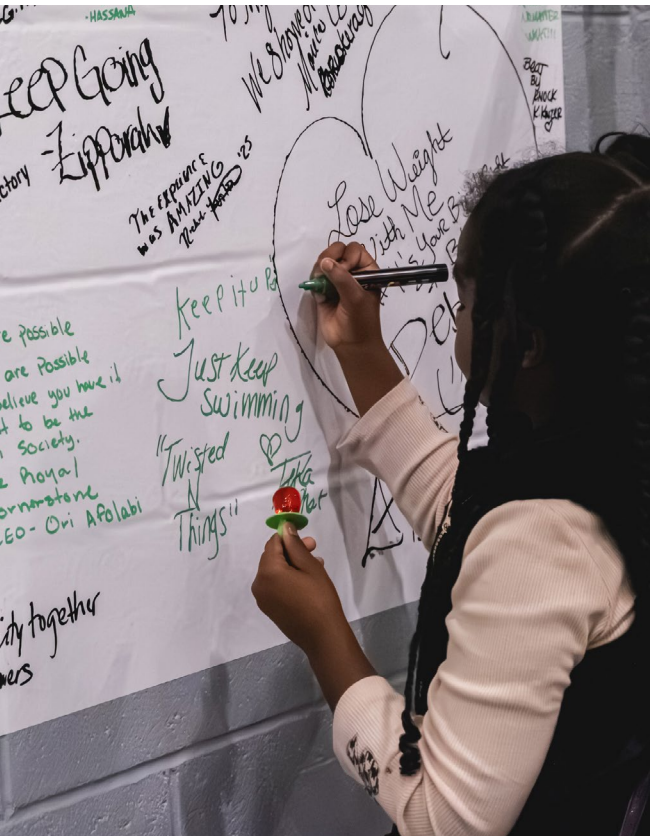

The History of Corner to Corner

2007

Will and Tiffany Acuff move off of Dickerson Road to try to get a “Theology of Neighbor”.

2011

The Dream Begins: After years of volunteering in the city and Tiff working with justice involved neighbors as a former offender job training specialist, the Acuffs sit on their back porch and dream of a Nashville **where *all* of their neighbors can flourish** on their own terms.



2012

Spring...

- Job readiness program launched at McFerrin Park to help former offenders tell their story redemptively and find employment, **with 20-30 attendees each week.**

This program would *later* evolve into The Academy!

- Launched Bible studies to create networks of support for individuals and families.

Fall...

- Started an **after-school reading tutoring program**, which would later evolve into Script to Screen!

2013

Tutoring, Bible studies, and job readiness programs grew steadily.

2014

November: Certificate of Existence It’s official y’all – **Corner to Corner is a nonprofit!**

2015

- Formation of board and learning how to fundraise.
- Started researching a **curriculum for entrepreneurship**. Found it through the CCDA conference.

2016

Spring...

- Nathan Arnold, an intern from Belmont University, joins the Acuffs as our first volunteer.
- Corner to Corner **receives a grant** to buy tablets for our after-school tutoring program at McFerrin park.

Originally called “*Business Entrepreneurship Academy*” or BEA, our **first ever class of entrepreneurs** starts to meet at McFerrin Park Rec Center.

2016

Cont.

Spring...

- **13 entrepreneurs graduate** from The Academy. Graduation is hosted at Blood Water Mission, with guest speaker Mignon Francois.



2017

- **January: First Facilitator Training** Keeping our program community-led it allows our entrepreneurs to see themselves in their own facilitators, and the potential for their businesses. This training is still in place.

Spring...

- **12 graduates** from The Academy, graduation hosted at Google Fiber HQ.
- Mary Elizabeth becomes the **first-ever employee**, working part time to run our afterschool programs.

Summer...

- We host our first fundraiser, for our kids’ literacy program “Taste the Reading Rainbow.”

Fall...

- Expanded our after school programs, reading tutoring and Hope Bakes, a program designed to encourage math skills and kitchen independence.
- **Expanded to multiple sites** of The Academy for the first time!
- **21 graduates** from The Academy, graduation hosted at The Lab.

This year, we got some of our first grants from: LaunchTN, Saint Thomas, Sponsorship from Reliable Property Solutions

2018

Spring...

- After the Wafflehouse shooting in Nashville, we collect and distribute funds for the families of victims.
- **31 graduates** from The Academy, graduation hosted at our partner’s site, NBIC.

Summer...

- Our after-school reading tutoring program becomes **Script to Screen**, running officially for the first time at McFerrin Park.
- We publish a Hope Bakes cookbook featuring recipes our youth created.

Fall...

October: Hosted our **first Academy headshot night** for entrepreneurs at McGruder, our co-founder Will taking most of the photos.

2018

Cont.

Fall...

38 graduates from The Academy, graduation hosted at Studio 615.

Winter...

We received more grants this year, specifically from **Charis Foundation and Memorial Foundation**, who still supports the work Corner to Corner is doing in Nashville years later.

2019

Spring...

- Script to Screen continues at McGruder and Hope Bakes continues at McFerrin Park.
- **31 graduates** from The Academy, graduation hosted at Studio 615.

Fall...

61 graduates from The Academy, graduation hosted at Studio 615.

Winter...

We receive our **first grant** for Script to Screen from the Preds Foundation.

2020

Spring...

- **March: The Tornado & Covid-19** We gave out 1630 STEAM learning kits to kids who weren’t able to go to school. That included over **\$19,000 in Visa gift cards** for essential supplies for families. In December we were also able to give **rent assistance** to over 50 families affected by the tornado and Covid-19 with our partners at The McGruder Center in North Nashville.



- **68 graduates** from The Academy, graduation hosted on Zoom. This is our first ever all-virtual cohort, due to Covid-19’s restrictions.
- Partner with behavioral scientists at Vanderbilt University to research Social Determinants of Health and Knowledge Gained/Retained in The Academy.
- We launch The Coalition, a small Be The Bridge group examining and **discussing inequity and racism in our society.**

Fall...

- **66 graduates** from The Academy, graduation hosted at Rockettown.
- Hope Bakes partners with Brightside Bakeshop to sell the kids’ cookbooks, raising \$550.

Winter...

Our Academy Alumni, now totaling 340, **generate an \$8 million impact on our local economy** (according to SBA data).

2021

Spring...

We launch The Academy Invested, our **0% interest rate loan program** for Academy Alumni.

- **75 graduates** from The Academy, graduation hosted at Rockettown.

First time having **10 class locations** for The Academy!

- Script to Screen expands to 3 locations.

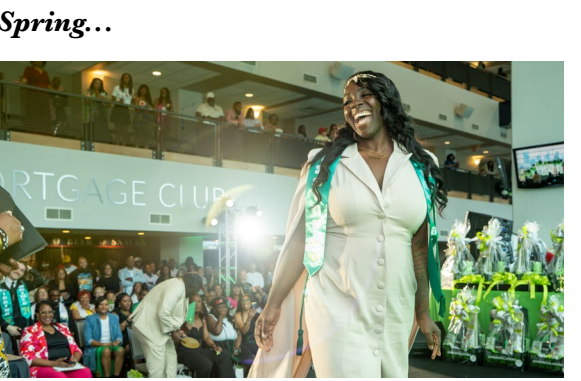

As we come to the close of this year, the word that rises to the surface for me is **gratitude**.

Gratitude for our neighbors. Gratitude for the courage it takes to build something where there once was nothing. Gratitude for the quiet, holy work of creation that happens every day at Corner to Corner. We spend a lot of time talking about businesses, revenue, and economic outcomes—and for good reason. *Money matters. Economic stability matters. Ownership matters.* We want to see our neighbors thrive financially, provide for their families, and build generational opportunity.

But if you spend even a few minutes in one of our classes, something deeper becomes obvious. You don’t *just* see businesses being built. **You see people coming alive.** In a world where so many feel disconnected from their work—and sometimes from their own sense of purpose—

we get to witness something rare and beautiful. We see neighbors rediscover their creativity. We see confidence take root. We see people remember that they are capable of making, shaping, and contributing something meaningful to the world around them. **There is something profoundly human about creating.**

From the very beginning, we were made in the image of a Creator. And when someone launches a food truck, opens a cleaning business, designs clothing, or offers a service their community needs, it is more than an economic act. It is an act of dignity. It is a declaration: *I have something to offer.*

This year, we have seen hundreds of neighbors step into that truth. They showed up after long workdays. They took risks while carrying real responsibilities. They pushed through fear, doubt, and exhaustion. And they built. **We are deeply grateful to everyone who made this possible**—our participants, staff, mentors,

donors, and partners. Your generosity fuels more than programs; it fuels purpose. It creates space for hope to take form in practical, tangible ways.

As we look ahead, **our commitment remains the same:** to walk alongside underestimated entrepreneurs as they build businesses—and as they rediscover themselves in the process.

Thank you for believing in our neighbors. Thank you for investing in creation. Thank you for helping to make this work possible.

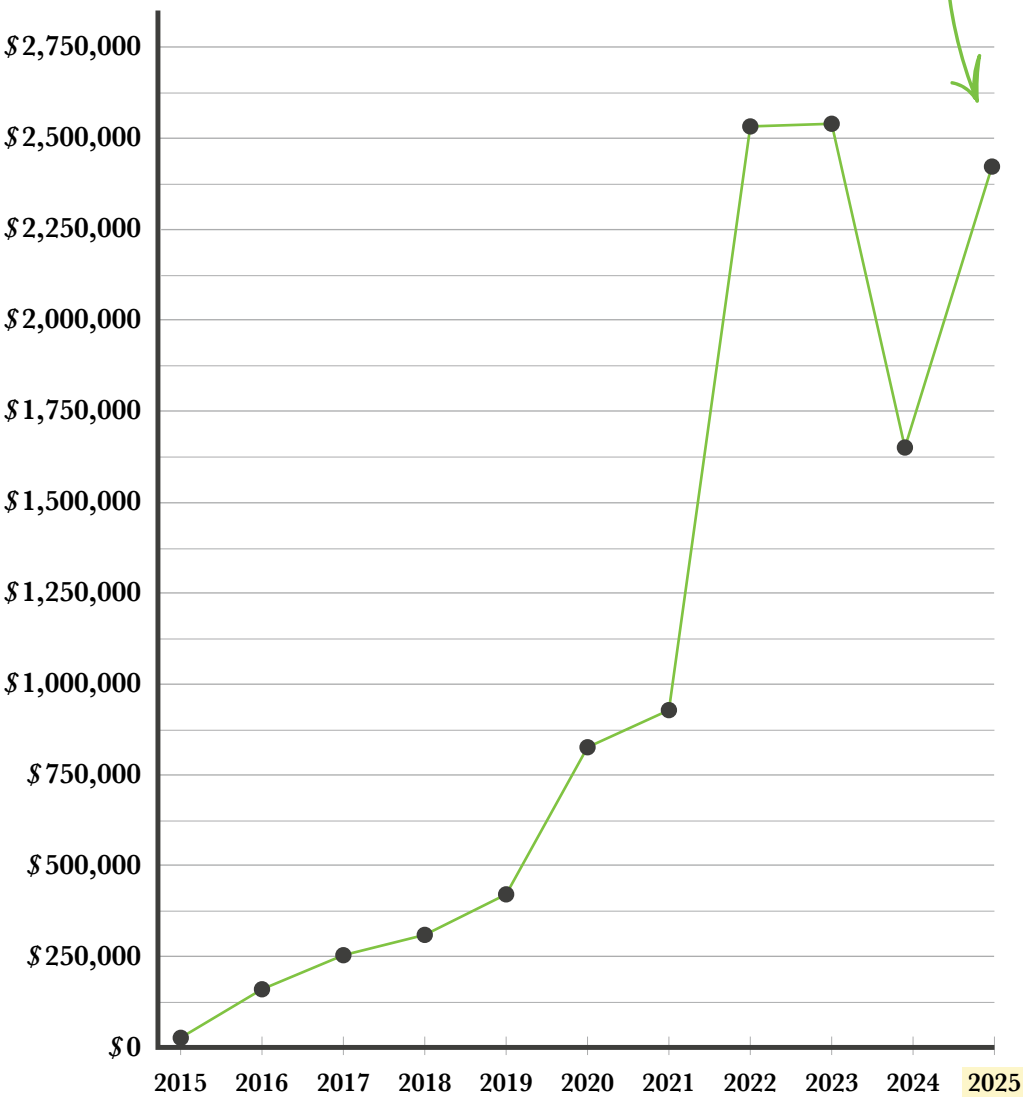

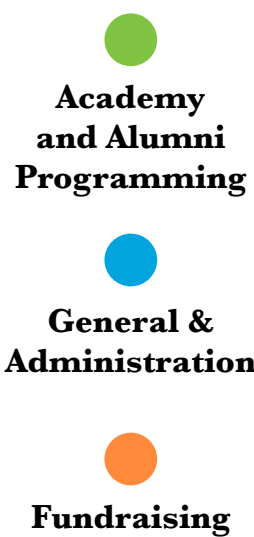
2025 Total Revenue

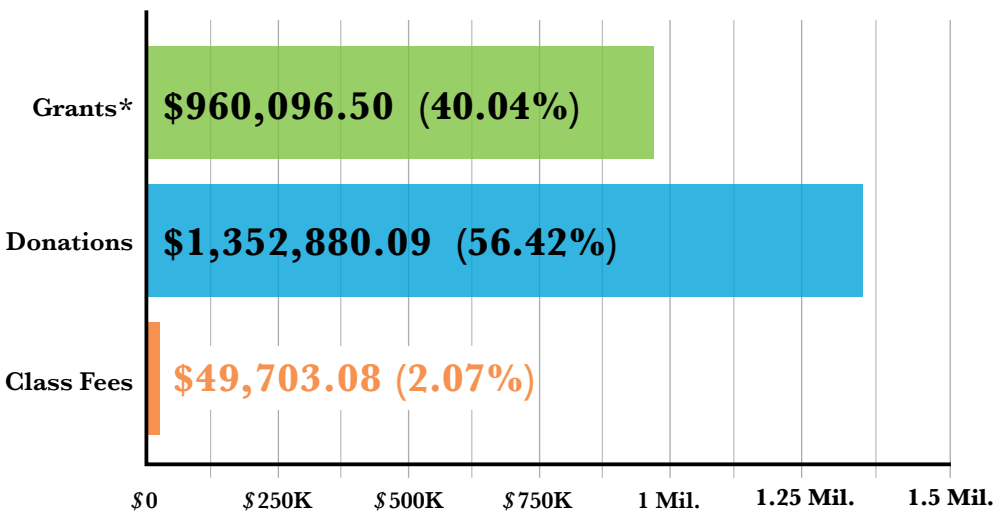
All Annual Revenue Totals


